

ELEMENTAL ENERGY AND PARTNERS AWARDED TWO WIND ENERGY PROJECTS IN NOVA SCOTIA

VANCOUVER, BRITISH COLUMBIA, August 19, 2022– Elemental Energy is extremely excited to announce that its two wind projects in development in Nova Scotia with partners Sipekne’katik First Nation and Stevens Wind have been selected as two of the winning bids in the Nova Scotia Rate Base Procurement process. The 100 MW Higgins Mountain Wind Farm and the 80 MW Wedgeport Wind Farm have both been awarded long term offtake contracts from Nova Scotia Power. These projects will build on Elemental’s existing portfolio of successful wind farms in Atlantic Canada and its track record of building projects with local and Indigenous partners.
